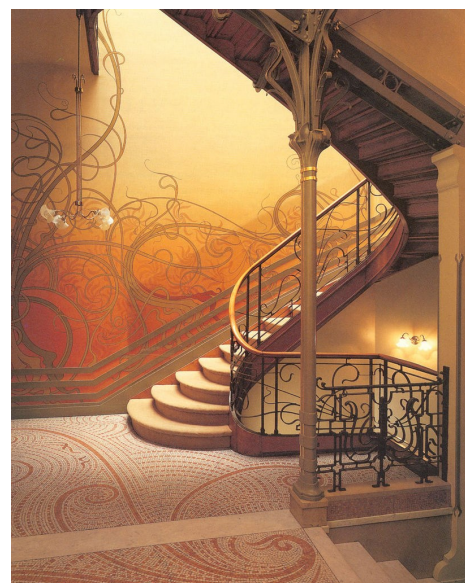
Day 1 Brussels - The heart of Europe

The style of art now widely known as Art Nouveau emerged in Brussels around 1890. This total art form, which reigned supreme until 1914, is not only reflected in the field of architecture but also left its mark on the design of furniture, tapestry, decorative objects and jewelry. Day 2 Ypres – The Great War

90 minutes drive to Ypres.

From 1914 to 1918 Flanders Fields was a major battle theatre in the First World War. 130 000 Indians (infantry & cavalry) were deployed to fight the war.

A battlefield tour by helicopter offers you a unique way to discover Flanders Fields from another perspective. During the flight you will get a breathtaking aerial view on the war heritage in the region.

Guided visit of the In Flanders Fields Museum, the Indian Forces Memorial near the Menin gate and Bedford House cemetery having Indian soldiers.

1 hour drive and overnight in Ghent.



Day 3 Ghent – Europe's best kept secret

A guide will pick you up at the hotel and take you for a stroll through the cobblestone streets of Ghent. We walk and talk about all the famous highlights Ghent has to offer such as the Castle of the Counts, the Belfry, the medieval skyline of guild houses, towers and churches, the cathedral etc. The guide will not hesitate to point out some of the small authentic local shops, bars and restaurants you pass by and are often overlooked as they tend to be hidden deep in the medieval heart of the city.

You can enjoy a guided boat tour.

You visit the Brewery for demonstrations, and to sample one (or more) of the five distinct beers made available for the ale connoisseur: Gruut White, Blond, Amber, Brown and Inferno.

30 minutes by car and overnight in Bruges.





Day 4 Bruges – Picture perfect

You will discover Bruges, the best preserved example of medieval Flanders. So picture postcard perfect is the city centre, the entire historical city centre is a Unesco World Heritage site.

A horse drawn carriage will pick you up from the hotel for a romantic ride along the canals and historical small bridges, relaxing to the gentle sound of the hoof beat of the horse. Along the way, you will find many small picturesque corners, several museums and other historical sites.

A guide will take you along the traces of the making of Peekay. The Love Song “Chaar Kadaam” was shot in Bruges. You start in the south part of Bruges. Surrounded by trees you’ll find the Lake of Love, an exceptionally romantic spot. From here you walk and explore the other shooting locations.

Whether you are a photography expert or a novice, a professional photographer will take you to all the most photogenic spots in town. What are the ‘must-have’ shots for the photo report of your visit to Bruges? You will learn this and lots more during a fascinating walk, with dozens of practical photography tips.

Day 5 Antwerp – Diamonds, fashion and shopping

90 minutes drive to Antwerp.

Find out more about Antwerp as a vibrant lifestyle city on this cultural exploration of the city, which focuses on contemporary design, architecture and history. The emphasis is on the more recent past when the city developed into a leading fashion centre. This reputation is largely due to the talent and perseverance of fashion designers such as the legendary Antwerp Six, who from the 80s onwards managed to carve out a niche for themselves in the fashion world. During this walk you will stop at shops, buildings and other places that were instrumental in the development of Antwerp as an international fashion city. And who knows, the specialised guide may reveal the fashion freak in you.

In the heart of the famous diamond district, at a walking distance from the renowned Diamond Bourse, lies the largest diamond showroom, with diamond polishers and goldsmiths at work. The expert guide will tell you about the rich history of Antwerp and the relationship it had with diamonds for more than 400 years. You will see the world’s most fascinating diamond rings, necklaces, bracelet, pendants and a large collection of rough and polished unset diamonds in all shapes and sizes.

The ultimate in luxury is being guided through the city by a personal shopper. He or she will take you to shops that fit your personal style whether that is classic, hip, avant-garde or casual.

Drive 90 minutes from Antwerp to Spa.

Day 6 – Spa, world’s original spa resort

Nestled in the Belgian Ardennes, Spa is the world’s original spa resort. This picturesque town has been a gathering place for Europe’s aristocracy for centuries. From the hotel have direct access to the famous mineral springs using the private funicular.

The abundance of healing mineral springs makes Les Thermes one of the world's top thermal destinations since the 16th century. In 2004, it re-opened with new Jacuzzis, Turkish baths, saunas and aqua-gym facilities. Additional relaxation areas feature infrared, wood, light and aromatherapy.

Only 800 meters from the hotel lies the Royal Golf Club des Fagnes, a highly ranked 18-hole golf course for golfers of all skill levels.

If you fancy trying your luck, Spa is also home to the world’s oldest casino!
